The GYROLOG December 2011

It is with sadness that we acknowledge the peaceful passing of Bryce Van Dusen on November 29th at the youthful age of 96. Bryce leaves Florrie, his love and companion for 71 years; his daughters Fran (Al Olsen), Helen (John Pope), Dixie Van Dusen (Luc Lascelle), his son in law, Roy Bennett (Bonnie 2003) and 10 grandchildren and 14 great-grandchildren.

Bryce was the last to survive of a family of 10 children (6 boys and 4 girls) of Miner and Mary Frances Van Dusen who raised their family on a farm near Griffen, Saskatchewan. Bryce was born on February 5th, 1915 and received his education in the consolidated school in Griffen. After completing grade eight, Bryce joined the working world but kept his love of sport by playing on local hockey and baseball teams. Work was scarce during the 1930's and he and his older brother Wes travelled to Calgary to work. Bryce found work as an electrician, wiring homes and garages.

Wes eventually moved to Edmonton where he started up the **Sun Specialty Company** which included carnival equipment. A call went south to Bryce in 1934 and he moved to Edmonton. Times were very difficult economically for most Albertan's but on a social level, people still found ways to enjoy life and among those outlets were fairs and carnivals. Into this world moved the Van Dusen brothers; they managed to buy a few "wheels of fortune" and other carnival equipment and toured the province adding their "magic" to the business.

The GYRO Club of Edmonton which had been formed in 1921 had immediately embarked on an ambitious children's playground development program. To fund these lofty initiatives the Edmonton Club turned to the idea of operating an annual carnival in the streets of downtown Edmonton. In the early 1930's the club purchased some of their own "wheels" and other carnival equipment from the Van Dusen brothers and the beginning of a long business and friendship relationship began. Later when the annual Gyro Carnival was moved from the streets to the Trocadero Building, Bryce helped organize the carnival and trained the club members in the operation of the equipment. In 1940, Wes became a member of the **Edmonton Gyro Club** but Bryce was not nominated for membership until **1965**, since the club did not allow two or more people from the same business sector.

Bryce would often travel to Calgary to help the Calgary Gyro Club operate their carnival. It was a natural shift for the Calgary Stampede to benefit from their knowledge. The Stampede Association rented Van Dusen equipment and the Van Dusen's trained their employees on the ways to operate the "wheels" and other "fair" equipment. As the fairs flourished, many of the young people trained by Wes and Bryce went on to become leaders in the world of casino operation. The GYROLOG December 2011 Today casinos are found everywhere in Canada but this was not the case 50 years ago. The Van Dusen brothers started the first legal casino ever operated in Canada. The years passed and the company name changed to **ACME Novelty Ltd**. with branches in Calgary, Vancouver, Victoria, Saskatoon and Regina. In 1968 the business was sold to Neonex which was owned by Jimmy Pattison.

Bryce's life was not limited to the wonderful world of carnival, in 1939 he entered the wonderful world of love when he met Florrie. Florrie's parents operated a small ice cream shop/cafe in the Coal Branch area southwest of Edson. This store featured a jukebox rented from the Van Dusen's. Florrie, who was attending high school in Edmonton, was asked by her mother to purchase some "decent" records for the jukebox from the Van Dusen's store. Florrie met Bryce and as they say "the rest is history". They were married in 1940 and started their family with two daughters. In 1943 Bryce volunteered to join the field artillery of the Canadian Army. In 1946, Bryce signed off the army's roster and headed home to Florrie and two more daughters followed.

Throughout their lives in Edmonton, the world of GYRO has been an integral part of Bryce and Florrie's social sphere. Even before joining the Edmonton Club, they participated as guests of Wes and his wife in Gyro parties and events. Bryce joined the Edmonton Club in 1965 and served as **President in 1969-70**. Bryce, like so many members of the Edmonton Gyro Club, was also a member of the Shriners and was a past Potentate of the Al Shamal Temple. In 1977, Bryce chaired the 1977 organizing committee for the first ever Shrine Convention held in Edmonton.

Bryce and Florrie for many years hosted the Annual Edmonton Gyro/Gyrette Golf Tourney barbeque at their "Flying V Ranch" north of Devon. Bryce's "official" time with GYRO spanned 46 years but his personal involvement goes back 77 years when he and Wes stated working with the Edmonton Gyro Club's playground carnivals in 1934.

Bryce's honesty and integrity touched thousands of lives and it was an honour and a privilege to experience his friendship in our club. Your Editor, when he was President of our club in 2006-07 was personally honoured by this remarkable man on a number of occasions when he phoned to check on my wellbeing and asked if he could help in any way. **A true sign of a gentlemen and a friend!**
