**Bill Carter** presented information on the three college friends who founded GYRO in Cleveland, Ohio in 1912.

Paul Schwan had the vision and burning desire to develop the friendship organization of GYRO. Paul was born in Cleveland and obtained a law degree. In 1918, he joined the U.S. Army as a private but on April 17th, after only 17 days of army life he died, a victim of the Influenza epidemic.

Gus Handerson, born in Cleveland in 1889, developed his vision to retain friendships through personal contacts and provided the practical leadership for the charter members. He was responsible for the first club bulletin, the GYROSCOPE and helped it to become interclub by 1918. He accepted a number of positions in Gyro in which he was preeminently successful. He died in 1942 of a heart ailment.

Ed Kagy, who was also born in Cleveland in 1889, was affectionately known as "the Grey Eagle". Ed was the Secretary Emeritus of Gyro International as well as being a tireless and enthusiastic member of the Cleveland Club from 1912 to 1923. In 1923, Ed consented to accept the responsibility as the paid Secretary-Treasurer of Gyro International. This new role became his lifetime work and was convinced that all he was and had, he owed to Gyro. He lived in Chagrin Falls, Ohio until his death in 1960.

- The first Calgary Stampede was held September 2nd to 5th.
- On October 16th, the Boston Red Socks beat the New York Giants in the Ninth World Series after eight games. The fifth game ended in a tie due to darkness.
