Our guests were Lerena Greig, Public Relations and Resource Director and Mark Evens, Board Chair of the Edmonton Dream Centre. John Mann introduced our guest speaker Lerena Greig. The Edmonton Dream Centre is a long-term inresidence facility for women in crisis and their children; women who struggle with drug and alcohol addictions, homelessness and other abuses. The unique intensive treatment program allows women the opportunity to work through their crises and still have their children live with them.

The Dream Centre began their life in 1998 as an outreach of the Inner City Mission. Its birth resulted from a growing need among women in the downtown area for a longer-term program that would result in real changes. It first operated from two houses on 96th Street that was less than ideal because the conditions from which women were fleeing (drugs, alcohol and prostitution were close at hand. In 2005 the Centre moved away from the inner city to a four story walk up apartment which can accommodate 16 women and nine children.

The Dream Centre helps women to restore their dignity; discover their identity and help them realize their dreams. Their recovery program has evolved from a one phase to three phase program. Since its inception it has provided assistance to over 400 women and now operates as a 365 day/24 hour operation. A short video was presented that showed how two women had successfully completed their program and are now in the community providing for their families with dignity and self-esteem.

Walter Yakimets thanked Lerena Greig for a very thought-provoking presentation.
