**Vice-President Peter Carter** welcomed an energetic group of GYROS and two guests to the February 2<sup>nd</sup> luncheon meeting held at the Royal Mayfair Golf Club.

Our guest speakers were Larry Wall, Executive Director of the River Valley Alliance. Larry is a University of Alberta, Physical Education graduate with a focus on Outdoor Education and Sport Administration. Paulina Retamales is a Physical Education teacher and received her Master's degree in 2013 in the areas of Sport Management and Sport/Recreation History. She is also an Outreach Program Specialist with the River Valley Alliance.

The **River Valley Alliance** is a not for profit corporation with charitable status governed by a board with representation from seven partner municipalities. Their vision: *To create a continuous metropolitan river valley park, from Devon through Parkland County, Leduc County, Edmonton, Strathcona County, and Sturgeon County to Fort Saskatchewan.* 

The Mission of the Alliance is: To preserve, protect and enhance the **North Saskatchewan** river valley, to create one of the largest river valleys parks in the world and create a legacy for generations to come.

The River Valley Alliance Area is 88km long and contains 7000 hectares or 18,000 acres with 10 million visits per year. Desired outcomes of the management of the area are Pride, Legacy, Quality of Life, Attraction and Tourism.

The Board of Directors consists of 16 voting members including: 8 elected officials, 7 Directors at Large and an Advisory Committee Chair.

A Plan of Action for the Capital Region River Valley Park (2007) was adopted unanimously, had 88% public support, integrates municipal plans, acts as a blueprint for development and includes major project funding. The estimated costs are \$605 million to complete including \$290 million for connectivity and access. Completed capital projects are: Lamoureux Historic Trail Signage, Sturgeon County; Louise McKinney River Front Park, Edmonton; Strachan's Landing, Fort Saskatchewan; Access trails to Fort Edmonton Footbridge, Edmonton and West River's Edge Pavilion, Fort Saskatchewan.


The 2012 to 2017 Capital Project includes 17 initiatives in 18 locations: Devon Riverfront Trails, Parkland County Prospectors Point trail upgrades, Leduc County Secondary Trail from Devon to Rabbit Hill; City of Edmonton, Terwillegar Pedestrian Bridge and connecting trails, Mechanized access to the river valley, Touch the Water Promenade; East Trails-Hermitage to Quarry Ridge and NE Anthony Henday Bridge to East Cloverbar, Boat docks and launches; Strathcona County- River Valley Nature Trail to Fort Saskatchewan; Fort Saskatchewan-


Redcoat Landing, West River's Edge, riverside trails and Sturgeon County-Lamoureaux Trail.

**Capital Program 2017-2022:** Emphasis on connectivity and access, Primary trail, Priority bridges, Secondary trails that can complete connectivity at lower cost; and Land acquisition or land access for trails and future parks.

**Paula Retamales** spoke about the Gyro Club of Edmonton's development and operation of Gyro Playgrounds in the 1920's and 1930's. The first three playgrounds were developed at Patricia Square Park, Kitchener Park and Tipton Park. The Tipton Gyro Playground Park is being updated in 2016.
