OBITUARY

The death occurred on Tuesday, January 19, 1982 of Bob Sheldon, a member of the Gyro Club since 1943. Bob and Libby had been visiting with son, Don, in Toronto in December when he was stricken. Following treatment in Sunnybrook Hospital for several days he returned to Edmonton where he passed away. Bob had been a resident of Edmonton since 1913 when his parents moved West from Toronto. Active in the fuel business, he took over in 1944 the family business, Sheldon Coal Co., founded by his father in 1933. On his retirement from business he served as Municipal Administrator for a number of summer villages in Alberta.

Throughout his life Bob was active in his business organization, the Western Fuel Association, and in service clubs such as Kinsmen and of course the Edmonton Gyro Club of which he was President in 1951, later serving as Treasurer for several years.

He was a friendly outgoing personality with a fine sense of humor. He always
