When he returned from the war he went to Toronto in 1947 to study for the ministry. He was ordained in May of 1953 and has been 'irreverent' ever since. [(When I checked the meaning of that word I had to put it in quotation marks because the real meaning is the exact opposite of Bill but those of us who know him will understand why the word came to mind). After that remark I am
