This event is known as the Tim Horton's "Roar of the Rings". Ron McGowan is the Facilities Manager for this event and his wife Bonnie McGowan is responsible for many of the administrative duties. **Dean Branting** is responsible for the construction side of the event and his wife Aimee Branting is looking after signage. Dean and Aimee are also one of the original founding families on Kandy Kane Lane in West Edmonton. Trina Spence is the Event Coordinator. She now serves a as the Program Director for 790 CFCW, CAM FM and W 1440. Her interest in curling developed at an early stage and as a competitor she went to the Canadian Junior Curling Championships and then made three trips to the Scott Tournament of Hearts.

Jackie-Rae has pulled back from her competitive curling so that she can lead the 950 plus volunteers through the largest and most prestigious curling event ever to be held in Canada. In March 2009, the Canadian Curling Association announced that Edmonton had been chosen to host this event based on a \$900,000 financial commitment and a proven track record with the hosting of the 1987, 1999 and 2005 Briar Curling Championships and the Worlds Men's Championships in 2007.

The Roar of the Rings Event will determine which two teams will advance to the 2010 Winter Olympics from an elite field of eight men's and eight women's teams. The elite field consists of Kevin Martin, Kevin Koe, Glen Howard, Randy Ferbey, Jeff Stoughton, Jason Gunnlaugson, Pat Simmons, Wayne Middaugh, Jennifer Jones, Shannon Kleibrink, Stefanie Lawton, Cheryl Bernard, Crystal Webster, Kelly Scott, Krista McCarville and Amber Holland.

On December 4th there will be an opening banquet at the new Northlands Expo Centre, followed by a practice session for the 16 teams on December 5th. The Briar Patch will be opening on this day and there will be a volunteer's dinner. The Opening Ceremonies will commence on December 6th at 11:00 am followed by the opening draw at 1:00 pm. This will be Boston Pizza Day and single tickets will be available for \$15. The attendance goal for this nine day event is 200,000 fans.

Over the last 88 years, there have been 12 District Governors and two International Presidents, Russ Carter and Marty Larson from the Edmonton Club. In addition, there have been five members who have received the Honour Key Award, 12 members who have received the Award of Merit, two members receiving The Gyrolog November 2009 3 the Jimmie Hubbell Award for external expansion and two who have received the Bud Mitchell Award (International Gyro of the Year).

Given the illustrious history of the Gyro Club of Edmonton it is fitting to welcome two new members to this induction ceremony. PDG Greig called on **Bruce Foy**, sponsor for **Jack Slobodan** and **Walter Yakimets**, sponsor for **Len Stevens** to support their new members and oversee their commitment and contribution to Gyro.
