On August 10, 2003 Fran and Vern Sadd celebrated their sixty-fifth wedding anniversary as was noted in the Edmonton Journal. Congratulations from all your Gyro and Gyrette friends.

Al McClure presented the history of the Hockey Pool and a number of Gyros wanted as much information as I could capture included here. Prior to 1980, the Gyros raised funds through casinos and bingos. In 1980 Harry and Ruby Mills started the hockey pool to raise money to make the lives of three individuals easier. For the following 12 years Harry and Ruby produced and sold approximately 200 tickets a year and over the period raised \$26,000 which the Gyros put to a variety of good causes.

From 1993 to the present Dave Duchak and Bob Lippe have been running the Hockey Pool, with major sales support from PIP Marty Larson. In that period an additional \$22,000 has been raised. At the end of the current season the Edmonton Gyro Club will have raised \$50,000 through the annual hockey pool.

The only year there was no hockey pool was 1994/95, the year of the hockey players strike. The money has also been used for Gyro Park #10 at Fort Edmonton Park, the plaque at the Fort, the Christmas Bureau, Rick Hansen's Man in Motion Tour, the cancer society, gerontology at the University of Alberta, the Salvation Army, Ezio Farone memorial park, the Food Bank, The ALS Society (Lou Gerhig's disease), and the police helicopter.

The funds from the Gyro Hockey Pool are clearly making a difference and in honour of **Harry** and **Ruby** we must ensure it thrives. If each Gyro purchased or sold five tickets the Hockey Pool would be a success and **Marty's** job would be a lot easier.

David Burnett suggested that the Executive consider using the money currently used to subsidize attendance at the International and District VIII conventions to pay for the registrations of 2 couples at the District VIII interim convention in Fairmont. The money would be for two couples who have never attended and it would promote interest in conventions.

THE GYRO PROSTRATE CANCER TOURNAMENT sponsored by the Edmonton Gyro Club and the Canadian Cancer Society is scheduled for June 9, 2004 and the Links Golf Course in Spruce Grove.
