August 2007 Convention – Committee update: Roger Russell on behalf of the Committee encouraged everyone who has not yet pre-registered to do so.

A recent visit by several committee members to Gyro Clubs in **Nelson, Cranbrook** and **Calgary,** to promote the Convention proved successful as they were well received and encouraged.

A great deal of interest was expressed in the **Fort McMurray trip**. The **Reynolds Museum** and **Devon** venues also drew interest.

The Guest speaker Dr. Henry Janzen was formally introduced, Dr Janzen is a U of A Professor and specializes in Neuropsychology.

Dr Janzen spoke on the subject of "*pedophiles*" he emphasized that the problem is very much on the increase and that although much research has been and continues to be carried out, present treatment can reduce but not eliminate the problem.

Statistically only 2 out of 10 "pedophiles" treated, presently do not repeat. Which indicates that as we understand the problem today, we are not curing it.

More research and money is needed to work on the medical aspects and broad changes within society itself are needed to deal with apparent root causes.

These include more interest in the problem at all levels of Government and Society in general.

The breakdown of "families", children being raised by single parents and step parents are all contributing factors.

*Pedophiles* are predominantly male, heavy drinkers and often drug users. They display lack of empathy to victims, show distorted thinking and usually have or have had problems in family relationships.

To sum up the situation, it appears that "we don't really know what to do and the problem is getting worse"

#### Editor's Comment.

Without doubt no one left the room, with any feeling of comfort other than the feeling that men such as **Dr Janzen** are putting their utmost into research and treatment as is available today, each and every one of us needs to contribute towards dealing with the problem in any way that we feel is possible, even if that contribution is only by making our voices heard.

**Dr Janzen** was thanked by Marty Larson and presented with the usual Gyro gift, followed by sustained applause from the Club.

Dr Janzen was asked to carry out the accustomed draw for the free lunch, Chuck Gerhart was the lucky recipient, (rumor has it that Chuck's card is marked within the deck)
